There is evidence that these approaches have had a positive impact on pupil wellbeing and confidence. However, due to COVID -19, many of these activities were curtailed / cancelled. This included the Ski Residential, although there were still costs involved.

The school will need to be mindful of planning any residential visits and stays in Ifield Life and follow Government Guidelines and school risk assessments before such activities can recommence. Activities that do not require an overnight stay to increase pupil wellbeing are invaluable and will continue to be planned.
