Artsmark Gold Award!



Ifield School has been on an Arts journey of epic proportions. Back in 2018, we made the pledge to develop the arts and cultural provision to raise our level from platinum to Gold!

We completed an audit of the current arts opportunities available to pupils both internally and externally, with the aim of raising the profile of the arts across the whole school, we created a pupil whole class survey to allow pupils to share what art forms they had not experienced and would like to experience. This information assisted us in planning an arts week which included, workshops led by external arts companies for every key stage, as a result of arts week, pupil engagement and wellbeing increased both in school and at home with one parent reporting "my child will not often talk about their day, but they have not stopped talking about arts week", and a variety of pupils asking: "That was brilliant! Can we do it again?" We are proud to say that Arts week is now an annual feature at Ifield School!

We are partnered with Naked Frank Theatre company to create a project with the aim of developing the drama curriculum and increasing staff confidence which had been identified as an area of development in our school development plan. Key Stage 3 pupils participated in a series of drama workshops and performed to their peers in an improvised and devised piece featuring their teachers.

Throughout the journey staff have worked with a multitude of artists and organisations to develop knowledge on drama, dance and visual arts. The Kent Music and Chiltern Music Therapy organisation have provided professional development for all staff, resulting in increased knowledge and skills relating to using music throughout all areas of personal learning and self-regulation.

The arts are now embedded across the whole curriculum with key features in the cornerstones and opportunities for pupils to perform and display artwork across all key stages.

All this and through a pandemic as well! We are thrilled that we have been awarded the GOLD award! Thank you to all pupils, students, staff and parents who have supported Ifield throughout this exciting journey!
