Families, I would like to take the opportunity to remind you of some important information and your continued support would be appreciated:

- Attendance: It is essential your child attends school every day. Full attendance ensures your child maintains their learning and achieves the best outcomes. We will contact any family if we have concerns about attendance and look at how we can work together to support you and your child. Please remember, the school day starts from 8:45am and all pupils should arrive no later than 9:15am in order to help prepare themselves to start their learning. Pupils' learning continues until 3:30pm each day when they are collected by family members or transport providers.
- Communication: We rely on your support and I ask that you keep sharing information about your family, such as, changes to home address, contact information, changes to arrangements at home, hospital appointments, changes to transport. This up-to-date information will help us to support your child and family.
