




Qualification Levels explained

Level	Qualification examples	Progression
<h1 style="color: #FFC000;">Entry Level</h1>	<p>Some students will begin the Entry Level qualifications in Year 10/11. The lowest grade is Entry Level 1 and the highest is Entry Level 3.</p> <p>Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Entry Level Certificate in subjects such as PE • Functional Skills at Entry Level in subjects such as Maths and English • ASDAN qualifications at Entry Level 	
<h1 style="color: #FFC000;">Level 1</h1>	<p>Once students have built up Entry Level qualifications they will move onto the Level 1 qualifications.</p> <p>Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any level 1 award, certificate, diploma, • Functional Skills at Level 1 – subjects such as Maths and English • The Arts Award • Sports Leadership • Dance Leadership • GCSE grade 3, 2 or 1 	
<h1 style="color: #FFC000;">Level 2</h1>	<p>Once students have built up to the Level 1 qualifications they will move onto the Level 2 qualifications. These will be in the same subjects as above, or higher GCSEs.</p> <p>Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any level 2 award, certificate, diploma, functional skills • GCSE grade 9, 8, 7, 6, 5 or 4 	
<h1 style="color: #FFC000;">Level 3</h1>	<p>Once students have built up to the Level 2 qualifications they will move onto the Level 3 qualifications.</p> <p>Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any level 3 award, certificate, diploma, • AS or A Levels
