Last term, Ifield School changed its Management Information System (MIS) and as a federation, we selected Arbor. The system holds data about your child, such as personal data, attendance records, family contact information.

Why do we need to make the change?

The Local Authority is ceasing its MIS contract and require Kent schools to choose.

What does the change mean?

- A Parent App is available to download and accessible via a web browser
- Communication i.e. emails/push notifications/SMS
- Making payments
- Consent forms
- Parents evening arrangements

When will the change happen?

- Arbor will go live during Term 4 for staff.
- Families will receive further information, including log in details during Term 5, but please continue to use ParentMail for payments until notified.
