General Information:

Welcome back to a new academic year. We all hope that you had a lovely summer and are very excited for the start of the new term. Our topic for Term 1 will be 'Escape to the Country'.

Literacy and Phonics:

In Literacy we will be looking at different texts linked to our topic 'Escape to the county' including 'The town mouse and the country mouse' and 'Lets go for walk' By Ranger Hamza. We will be continuing to develop our phonic skills through the use of Little Wandle and looking at spelling punctuation and grammar to develop writing sentences.

Maths:

In Maths this term we will be looking at place value and addition and subtraction building on the skills we already have. We will be using White Rose with support of manipulatives to develop our understanding and problem solving.



Science:

This term in Science we will be learning about different animal groupings and food chains, developing our knowledge of types animals. We will be exploring characterises and why animals fit into each group.

Computing:

This term we will be recapping and learning about how to continue to be safe online. We will be looking at coding and looking at how different countries use technology linking to our topic.



Art and Design & Technology

In Art, Design & Technology this term we be looking at different types of pattern. We will be looking at flags from different countries and looking at and creating animal patterns.

Food Tech

This term we will looking at different types of food from around the world. We will also be making bread linked to the celebration of harvest. We building on our skills to follow a recipe and measure out ingredients correctly

Geography

In Geography we are developing the use of maps. We are also going to be looking at where countries are and comparing different countries.

PSHE (Personal, social and health education) and RSE

This term we will be looking at how to be friends, building relationships and playing cooperatively. We will also be looking at how to listen to and respect opinions.
