<p>Foundations for Literacy</p> <p>During our Literacy focus we will share sensory stories and use and recognise different symbols/pictures within a book. We will recreate a story using photos in the woods and listen to sounds heard. We will have opportunities to engage with high contrast patterns, light sources and environmental sounds and explore mark-making in tactile activities including creating leaf rubbings.</p>	<p>Foundations for Maths:</p> <p>During our Maths focus sessions we will be learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We will be counting Characters and ordering numbers. Through roleplay we will be creating an ice cream shop, counting coins/1:1 correspondence. We will be tracking objects as they move/drop and sorting (natural) objects into sets.</p>	<p>Understanding the world</p> <p>This term Ash Class will be taking part in listening walks, following a Fairy Trail, finding where the Gruffalo characters are in the woods. With support, pupils will notice changes pointed out by adults and they will explore objects by scrunching, shaking, sliding, tearing, banging and throwing.</p>	<p>Fine Motor Skills</p> <p>Ash Class will have lots of opportunities to develop their fine motor skills. We will be using different tools to manipulate play dough and other sensory materials. We will be using different mark making materials e.g. Leaf and bark rubbings</p>
<p>Art/Design</p> <p>This term we will be exploring shadows, silhouettes, light and dark. We will be creating 'fairy wands' with natural objects and imitating environmental sounds in their own manner when interacting with familiar adults.</p>	<p>Fun With Foods</p> <p>Foods can cause anxieties for our pupils with ASD. Ash Class will be following the Fun with Food programme to help develop your child's tolerance of different smells and textures. This term we will be continuing to explore different foods.</p>	<p>Therapies</p> <p>Ash Class will be accessing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cleverfingers • Write from the start • Gong Therapy • Therapeutic Music • Brushing • Compressions • Sensory Circuits • SLIC support • OT support <p>As required following observations and Assessments by our therapists</p>	<p>PSHE (Personal, social and health education) and RSE</p> <p>Ash Class will be developing confidence during transition into their new classrooms. We will be using Stickman as a prompt to create a 'Family Tree' display - belonging to our new classes. We will be learning about the class rules, routines, familiarisation with new peers and staff in their classes.</p>
<p>Physical Education:</p> <p>PE will be on a Friday, this term we are going to be developing our skills in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Running, jumping, climbing, throwing and kicking. • Moving using different parts of the body • Obstacle course/trail, under/over, branches/logs <p>Swimming will be on a Wednesday day. We are continuing to develop our confidence in the water.</p>	<p>Communication/Language</p> <p>Personalised Speech and Language targets will be created to enable early communication. These include initiation, nursery rhymes, Curiosity Programme, Attention Autism (Explore only), EHCP targets, 1-1 interventions, and Intensive Interaction.</p>	<p>PE Enrichment</p> <p>Ash Class will have PE Enrichment on Tuesday afternoons. This term Ash Class will be taking part in rebound therapy which is used to facilitate movement, promote balance, promote an increase or decrease in muscle tone, promote relaxation, promote sensory integration, improve fitness and exercise tolerance, and to improve communication skills.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>Ash Class will develop listening skills through identifying different sounds linked to their topic and those of percussion instruments. We will be exploring wooden percussive instruments and experiencing a range of classical music and music from 'In the Night Garden'. We will experience a range of sung songs and gong therapy.</p>
