1 ziplock clear plastic bag

Blue food colouring

Hair gel

Sequins

You will nee

- If you haven't got snowflake buttons, cut out the snowflake templates and either laminate them or cover them in sticky back plastic.
- 2. Put some hair gel and food colouring into the zip lock bag.
- 3. Add as much or as little food colouring as you like, depending on how dark you would like it to be. It will be easier to see the buttons and sparkles if it's not too dark!
- 4. Add the buttons, sequins, glitter and any other snowflake resources you have and spread them evenly in the bag.
- 5. Close the top of the bag securely. You may want to use sticky tape for a leak-proof seal.
- 6. Children will enjoy squashing the bag and moving the snowflakes around.
