Craft Instructions


Lucky Fish

Supplies

- Fish template
- A4 coloured card
- PVA glue
- Coloured tissue paper
- Scissors







Print the fish template out onto coloured card. Using scissors, carefully cut around the outline of the fish. Also cut the inside section of the fish out; you may need an adult to help with this.



Spread glue onto the outer edge of the fish template. Then place strips of the tissue paper going vertically over the cut out middle of the fish. Rub them down gently so that they attach to the template.



Cut long, thin strips of tissue paper in different colours. Place them in a pile, one on top of the other, then fold the pile back and forth, making them into a concertina.



Continue to build up layers of tissue paper, ensuring that each one overlaps. Once the fish template is completely covered, leave to dry.




Cut a semicircle out of the top and bottom of your folded tissue paper. Now you can open the strips out again ready to decorate your fish.



Once dry, carefully cut around the outer edge of the fish. This should leave you with a fish shape with some beautiful coloured scales in the middle!






Supplies


