

Heart-Shaped Wreath

Supplies

- Red or pink card
- Red and pink paint
- Ribbon
- Hole punch
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Cardboard tube







Cut out your template using the scissors and then draw around it onto your chosen colour of card. We recommend that you do not cut out your wreath yet, as this will give a more stable surface to print onto.



Once the paint has dried slightly, print some thumbprint hearts onto the wreath. Do this by using two thumbprints, each at an angle, making sure that they overlap at the bottom. Leave to dry.



Take the cardboard tube and pinch the two sides of one of the circular openings to form a valley fold and gently press the bottom of the opening into a point. When the tube springs open again you should be left with a heart-shaped opening.



Once dry, cut out your wreath carefully.



Dip this end of your tube into a little bit of paint and print onto the wreath outline. Repeat this a few more times and leave the paint to dry.



Finally use the hole punch to make some holes along the top outer rim of the heart. Cut a short length of ribbon and thread it through the holes to create a loop that you can use to hang your heart up.



Heart-Shaped Wreath



Supplies

- Red or pink card
- Red and pink paint
- Ribbon

Step 3. Dip this end of your tube into a little bit of paint and print onto the wreath outline. Repeat this a few more times and leave the paint to dry.



Step 4. Once the paint has dried slightly, print some thumbprint hearts onto the wreath. Do this by using two thumbprints, each at an angle, making sure that they overlap at the bottom. Leave to dry.



Step 5. Once dry, cut out your wreath carefully.



Step 6. Finally use the hole punch to make some holes along the top outer rim of the heart. Cut a short length of ribbon and thread it through the holes to create a loop that you can use to hang your heart up.
