Paper Plate Dragon

Supplies

- A paper plate
- Coloured card
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- An empty, cardboard egg box
- PVA glue
- Scissors



- Wobbly eyes
- Pom-poms





First, fold the paper plate in half. Using the scissors, cut triangle shapes around the rim of the plate to create the dragon's teeth.



To create a nose for your dragon, stick two pom-poms onto the side of the remaining segment.



Next, paint the dragon's teeth one colour and the rest of the folded plate another colour. Make sure that you do this on both sides of the plate, then leave to dry.



Stick the eyes and nose onto the plate using the PVA glue and hold in place for a few moments. Leave to dry.



Now draw a large tongue shape onto the coloured card and cut it out. Stick the tongue onto the bottom inside half of the paper plate, so that it is sticking out of the dragon's mouth.



You could also add some eyelashes to your dragon. To do this, cut some strips of card, long enough to go around half of an egg box segment. Then cut slits into the card to create individual eye lashes — make sure you don't snip all the way along! These can then be glued on using PVA glue.



Carefully cut out three segments from the egg box. Paint the egg box segments and leave to dry.



Now make the eyes for your dragon! To do this, stick a wobbly eye inside the base of two of the egg box segments.



Paper Plate Dragon



Supplies

- A paper plate
- Coloured card
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- An empty, cardboard egg box
- PVA glue

- Scissors
- Wobbly eyes
- Pom-poms





Step 1. First, fold the paper plate in half. Using the scissors, cut triangle shapes around the rim of the plate to create the dragon's teeth.



Step 2. Next, paint the dragon's teeth one colour and the rest of the folded plate another colour. Make sure that you do this on both sides of the plate, then leave to dry.



Step 3. Now draw a large tongue shape onto the coloured card and cut it out. Stick the tongue onto the bottom inside half of the paper plate, so that it is sticking out of the dragon's mouth.



Step 4. Carefully cut out three segments from the egg box. Paint the egg box segments and leave to dry.




Step 5. Now make the eyes for your dragon! To do this, stick a wobbly eye inside the base of two of the egg box segments.



Step 6. To create a nose for your dragon, stick two pom-poms onto the side of the remaining segment.



Step 7. Stick the eyes and nose onto the plate using the PVA glue and hold in place for a few moments. Leave to dry.
